Awards Fifteen More Scholarships to its 2025 Graduates

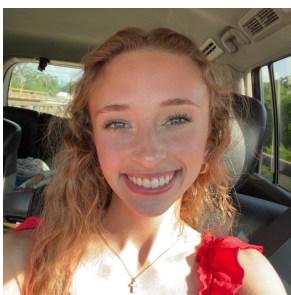

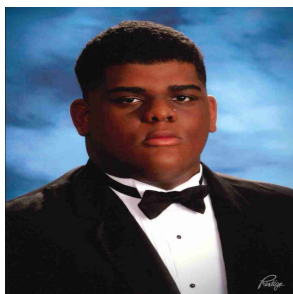
