### Holiday Garbage Collection

### Fireworks Rules

Any property owner using fireworks must abide by the following rules:



1. **The use of fireworks is permissible only on December 31<sup>st</sup> and January 1<sup>st</sup>.**
2. Due to the potential of fire, the shooting of fireworks commonly referred to as "bottle" or "sky" rockets or similar projectiles that are mounted on a base that resembles a stick or rod is prohibited.

### Christmas Trees Needed for Fish Habitats

After Christmas, the Lake Quality Committee will be collecting live Christmas trees for use as fish habitats in the lake. Leave your bare tree by the edge of the roadway after the holidays and Lake Quality will collect it. Please ensure you remove ALL decorations including tinsel, lights, ornaments, etc. Only natural trees (non-flocked) may be utilized.

- Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! 2024 was another great year for our/your community and I will continue to pray that we keep it rolling in 2025. Words cannot express how thankful I am for working for this great, large-scale community and I am so thankful for the many volunteers, Board of Directors, and property owners that come in to discuss the community with me as well as attend various meetings and community events. Active participation is how and why this community will continue to be great place to live. We had our challenges in 2024, but with your help and dedication, we were able to take care of the business side of this community. I am looking forward to continuing to work together for the betterment of this great, large-scale private community by working together. I sincerely thank you; I am truly grateful. Below is a recap of the hot topics and projects currently in works.
- This month we are performing a Security Camera System upgrade at all Common Grounds. This upgrade will include a better DVR and recording capabilities at night. The capital improvement cost of \$5,480.00 was paid to Fort Know Security Systems, LLC.
- Roadway safety is vital to the community. Safety Over Speed is always a hot topic along with education, enforcement, and engineering. This month you will begin to see a radar speed sign with Street Smart Technology that will collect data on speeds and traffic numbers. This capital cost of \$4,123.00 was paid to RadarSign, LLC.
- Last year's fiscal year (October 1, 2023 - September 30, 2024) will be audited by CPA firm Grantham Poole. This will be complete this month.
- The Operational Fee increase of 2.5%, which is \$2.36, will begin with statements due on January 25, 2025. This has been approved by the Finance Committee and the Board of Directors after review.
- The dredging contract has been signed with American Sportfish and is planned to begin this month. Four areas were selected for a total of 6,850 cubic yards of sediment to be removed. The total for this capital project is \$145,000.00. The Four locations are as follows:
  - Mallard Cove/530 block of West Lakeshore Drive
  - Eagle Cove/ 900 block of East Lakeshore Drive
  - Mockingbird Cove/1730 block of East Lakeshore Drive
  - Pelican Cove/Back area of the Horseshoe
- The drainage improvement projects located at 1702 and 1832 East Lakeshore Drive have been completed by Dillard and Sons. \$41,180 was paid to Dillard and Sons and Sunny Sod for this capital improvement project.
- The spillway chute was repaired last month as required by the DEQ. The materials cost a total of \$10,197.40. Concrete and riprap work, pump truck operation, and labor was completed by the HAWL Maintenance Department.
- The Office server upgrade and purchase of three replacement computers were completed last month by NVI technologies. The total for this capital improvement was \$7,466.72.
- The firehouse wall and roll up door that were damaged were repaired last week by Picayune Door Sales, Inc. The total capital improvement cost of \$6,102.96 was paid by Pearl River County through an insurance claim. Additionally, two new commercial openers were installed on each firehouse roll up door for a total capital cost of \$3,259.38.
- Seventy-five water meters and valves were purchased as part of our replacement project. \$15,696.10 was paid to Ferguson Waterworks for this capital purchase.
- The Membership Update was mailed to all property owners in November. Having up-to-date information on file with the Hide-A-Way Lake Office is vital. Please review and update your information with the Office.
- Griner Drilling performed the pump tests on all three water wells (#2, #3, and #4). All pump tests showed good results. The total cost was \$1,701.30.
- I would like to thank all of the property owners that have come to show support for and learn information about your community by attending a Community Meet and Greet with the General Manager. In addition to these meetings, my door is always open to you. I encourage your suggestions and/or concerns regarding the improvement of the community. Community members working together is essential to protect, maintain, enhance, and preserve not only the community but your home as well.

Nothing shall be erected on any lot without an approved building permit in writing by the HAWL Office.

ALL permit applications must have the following:

- Site/plot plan showing all existing and requested improvements
- Set of building plans to code
- Specification of materials

Permit requests are reviewed by the Architectural Committee on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of each month. Please ensure that all permit application requests are completed with all supporting documents attached the Monday before the scheduled meeting by noon.



## Issue With Your Sewer System?

Should an issue arise with your sewer system (such as your sewer alarm sounding), contact the PRCUA (601-799-5259 or 228-205-4101 for after hours emergencies). The PRCUA would like to remind residents they are on-call 24/7 to resolve grinder pump issues. It is important to notify the PRCUA as quickly as possible when your system goes in alarm mode to prevent overflows, restore service, and minimize the chance of destroying a locked pump. This number should be called prior to contacting a plumber since most issues can be handled by the PRCUA at no cost to the property owner. The number is in service 24 hours a day/7 days a week.

## Waste Management Trash Collection Guidelines

- Carts must be placed by the roadway no later than 5:00 am the day of collection with the street side of the Waste Management cart facing outward as labeled. Keep carts away from any mailboxes, vehicles, etc.
- **If you only use the Waste Management cart, nothing has changed; place all items for collection in the cart.**
- All household waste must be placed in the Waste Management cart. Other debris may be placed in the Waste Management cart but **do not place any household waste in the personal carts.**
- Two separate trucks are collecting carts: one for Waste Management carts and another for all personal carts. **You are allowed a maximum of three personal carts for other debris (cardboard and yard waste such as limbs, pine straw, and leaves), not household waste.** A cart from another company even if it is the same size, shape, etc., is considered a personal cart.
- After collection, remove all carts from the roadway.
- **If your carts were missed for collection, contact the HAWL Office at 601-798-1484 no later than 8:30 am the following day, otherwise carts must wait for the next collection date.**

Fines for citations are based upon the type of offense, such as rate of speed as well as the number of times the specific offense has occurred within a two year time period for the particular offender. Citations are not reported to insurance companies unless the offense is deemed significant enough, such as property damage or bodily injury. **During the months of June and July, all traffic violation fines are doubled.** The goal is to create awareness of roadway safety, not to collect fines.

## Hosting a Holiday Party?

Having a party for the holidays? Please be mindful of your neighbors in regards to both parking and noise. Pay attention to excessive vehicle parking in the easements as this can create unsafe conditions for drivers and pedestrians. Also be sure to not let the noise get too loud. Per Covenant 51 b. 1. "Loud or boisterous conduct including operation of loud motor bikes, outboard motors, vehicles, boom-boxes, etc., on any property which disturbs the peace of adjoining Lot Owners" is prohibited.



## Gate Entrance/Exit for the Holidays

With the holiday season being a busy time for the Front Main Gate, please **ensure that all guests are pre-registered with the gate before they arrive**. Not to worry, Santa has already been pre-registered. Use the app or the web portal for Gate Sentry to input your visitors into the system BEFORE they arrive at the gate. Please only use the phone call option when the app or web portal is not available to you. Phone calls must be from a phone number registered through the HAWL Office. When calling, only a maximum of two guests may be registered. Calls may only be taken 48 hours in advance. Guest Registration Forms must be used when registering three or more guests.

These forms are available on the HAWL website and at the Front Main Gate and the HAWL Office. By not using the app or web portal, the gate becomes very busy and it delays dispatching urgent calls for patrol assistance to owners and causes gate entry delays.





The following list is the administrative fees which may be levied against property owners for the violations of the rules of Hide-A-Way Lake by themselves, their children, guests, tenants (renters), and their contractors. All traffic fines that occur within or near a common grounds area (such as playgrounds, the marinas, the Lodge, etc.) will be doubled. During the months of June and July, all traffic violation fines will be doubled. The goal is to create awareness of roadway safety, not to collect fines.

**\*For example:**

- 1<sup>st</sup> violation for speeding under 10 mph over speed limit = \$50
- 2<sup>nd</sup> violation for speeding under 10 mph over speed limit = \$100

**\*\*Club privileges may be suspended, plus stated fine.**

**+++Anyone with 10 repetitive traffic fines in a two year period will be barred from driving in HAWL. If offender is caught driving after being barred, there will be \$1,000 fine charged to the account.**

**###Three lake violations in one boat decal season will result in the revoking of all boats for the property owner.**

**Rules, Lake Fines, and Administrative Fees are also available in the Property Owners Manual.**
