In addition to the full menu, Waters Edge features a Kids Menu with options sure to impress even the pickiest eaters. Little ones can choose from a variety of options that all include their choice of either French fries or potato chips.

Two additional radar signs were purchased from RadarSign, LLC for a total cost of \$7,950.00. These signs are currently installed at the 300 block of East Lakeshore Drive as well as the 200 and 800 block of Hide-A-Way Lane. Extra security staffing for the Summer season has started for common grounds and the lake. Extra radar details for roadway safety have been added. The Pearl River County Sheriff's Office has been scheduled for details on holidays.

The main pool pump/filter system has been replaced by Anything Pools, Inc.. The total capital improvement cost was \$28,400.00. The pool opens with lifeguards on Saturday, May 17, 2025. Swimming pool hours are Tuesday – Saturday, 10:00 am – 8:00 pm and Sunday, 12:00 pm – 8:00 pm.

New ropes and buoys for the swimming area at the beach were installed last month. The total capital improvement cost was \$1,299.96.

The 2" boring missile for water service lines that goes underneath roadways was purchased last month from Ditchwitch Midsouth. The total capital purchase cost was \$4,627.08.

The Main Gate entrance wall fence between the brick columns was installed by Randy Taylor Fence Company. The total capital cost was \$1,780.00.

An additional fish feeder for our lake was purchased through Texas Hunter Products. The total capital purchase was \$1,664.63. Feeders are located at the West Marina, the dam/walking track, and now at the Lodge/East Marina.

A cooking oil filtration machine was purchased from Gulf Coast Equipment Care, LLC for a total capital purchase of \$2,675.00. This purchase will save approximately \$7,000.00 yearly in oil costs.

The Capital Budget for next year and the 10 year plan is being worked on this month by staff, the Finance Committee, and the Board of Directors. This will be published next month.

The permit with the US Fish and Wildlife Service for Canadian Goose Nest and Egg Depredation is underway. The registration number is RG-04840A. As of May 9, 2025, there were 5 nests and 28 eggs.

The Water Systems Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) for 2024 has been updated and will be published next month for review.

All generators (Water Well #3, Water Well #4, the Main Gate, and Lodge) received major maintenance from Taylor Generators for the total cost of \$4,070.00.

The Scholarship Foundation for Hide-A-Way Lake Students will be awarding scholarships after the concern time portion of the Board Meeting on Tuesday, June 10, 2025. I want to thank the Foundation for all of the hard work they have done for kids in this community.

All insurance policies were renewed last month for a total of \$107,170.50 with Eagan Insurance for the period of April 30, 2025, through April 30, 2026:

• Property/General Liability: \$71,083.00

• Crime: \$1,127.00

• Directors and Officers: \$9,840.00

• Tower: \$13,942.50

• Auto: \$8,478.00

• Hull/Boat: \$2,700.00

On June 8, 2025, from 2:00 pm – 4:00 pm, there will be a retirement celebration at Waters Edge for our Restaurant Manager Ginger Gautrau who has been with Hide-A-Way for nearly 15 years. The community is invited to attend. Ginger has been a blessing to me and to this community during her time with us. Waters Edge and Hide-A-Way Lake has definitely changed for the better under her leadership. We will truly miss Jennifer "Ginger" Gautrau. I am so proud and thankful to have worked together with her over the years. She has taught me so much and HAWL will continue to keep this great amenity growing.

I would like to thank all of the property owners that have come to show support for and learn information about your community by attending a Community Meet and Greet with the General Manager. In addition to these meetings, my door is always open to you. I encourage your suggestions and/or concerns regarding the improvement of the community. Community members working together is essential to protect, maintain, enhance, and preserve not only the community but your home as well.

A Board Meeting was held on May 13, 2025. The next Board Meeting is Tuesday, June 10, 2025, at 6:30 pm. Full copies of the minutes from Board Meetings are on HAWL's website (hawlms.com) under the Board of Directors tab. The Manager's Report is included in the minutes.

For April 2025, the number of houses to date is 993. The Architectural Committee approved the following: 1 addition, 2 fences (2 privacy); 2 patios, 1 screened in porch, and 1 shed.

The Treasure's Report had a grand total of \$432,567.04.

Security, Safety, & Fire Committee - Kathy Busco

Property owners have voiced their concerns and measures are in place to address roadway safety in the community. Two additional radar signs were purchased and have been displayed in the community in the 200 and 800 block of Hide-A-Way Lane. Comments regarding these signs reflect positive feedback from the community. Also, there is an extra guard scheduled to perform traffic enforcement. This is a trial period during the community's heavier traffic times. Additionally, to address the concern of roadway safety, all traffic fines in June and July will be doubled. Lastly, scooter and bicycle safety is of the upmost importance. These efforts are in conjunction with the Security Committee's goal to promote safety and traffic awareness. Please support the committee by reminding your residents and guests of traffic safety.

Lake Quality – Joe Battaglia

Water samples were collected from four locations on May 5, 2025. The test results of all samples were within the Mississippi Standard for Recreational Waters.

Rainfall for the month of April was measured at 5.04 inches, which was 0.50 inches below the thirty-year April average of 5.54 inches. Rainfall to-date was 17.15 inches which was 4.59 inches below the thirty year-to-date April average of 21.74 inches.

The Lake Quality Committee received the third automatic directional fish feeder on April 29, 2025. The total cost of the feeder plus shipping was \$1,664.63. The feeder will be installed on the dock by the tennis courts.

The Spring Fishing Rodeo is to be held Saturday, May 17, 2025. Weather prediction is great, so invite your friends, check your fishing gear, and join us at this popular annual event. For details see the May *Echoes*.

Gate Entrance/Exit for the Summer

With the summer season being a busy time for the Front Main Gate, please <u>ensure that all guests</u> <u>are pre-registered with the gate before they</u>

arrive. Use the app or the web portal for Gate Sentry to input your visitors into the system BEFORE they arrive at the gate. Please only use the phone call option when the app or web portal is not available to you. Phone calls must be from a phone number registered through the HAWL Office. When calling, only a maximum of two guests may be registered. Calls may only be taken 48 hours in advance. Guest Registration Forms must be used when registering three or more guests. These forms are available on the HAWL website and at the Front Main Gate and the HAWL Office.



the Front Main Gate and the HAWL Office. By not using the app or web portal, the gate becomes very busy and it delays dispatching urgent calls for patrol assistance to owners and causes gate entry delays.

Do Not Feed the Animals

Please do not feed any wild animals, such as raccoons, geese, ducks, etc. This also includes feral cats. This is dangerous not only for the community, but for the animals as well. These actions can lead to several consequences, such as the animals not developing essential foraging



skills, losing fear of humans which leaves the animals susceptible to harm, and causing health problems for the animals since they are eating food that is not nutritionally complete.

Underage Drinking and Public Intoxication

Underage drinking and public intoxication are not tolerated on any common grounds (beach, parks, walking track, etc.) in HAWL. In addition to receiving a citation, the Sheriff's Department will be contacted.



Architectural Monthly Recap Information as of May 22, 2025

Nothing shall be erected on any lot without an approved building permit in writing by the HAWL Office.

ALL permit applications must have the following:

- Site/plot plan showing all existing and requested improvements
- Set of building plans to code
- Specification of materials

Permit requests are reviewed by the Architectural Committee on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month. Please ensure that all permit application requests are completed with all supporting documents attached the Monday before the scheduled meeting by noon.

Personal Trash Carts

Per Waste Management, it is highly recommended to use the large green cart issued by them. These carts are specifically designed to be used with the arm on their trucks. Personal carts, which include carts from previous companies, may be broken by this arm since they are not designed for its use. If

your personal cart is broken, Waste Management will not replace it per their contract. If your Waste Management cart is broken, contact the HAWL Office.



Issue With Your Sewer System?

Should an issue arise with your sewer system (such as your sewer alarm sounding), contact the PRCUA (601-799-5259 or 228-205-4101 for after hours emergencies). The PRCUA would like to remind residents they are on-call 24/7 to resolve grinder pump issues. It is important to notify the PRCUA as quickly as possible. The number is in service 24 hours a day/7 days a week.

Please understand: Flushable wipes are <u>not</u> flushable and will damage the system.

Call 811 Before You Dig

Most of the utility companies that supply your home are delivering services via underground service lines. It is possible that these buried service lines are close to the surface, making digging dangerous. Fortunately, you can find out where <u>utility owned</u> lines are buried on your property with one **FREE** call to Mississippi **8-1-1** or **1-800-227-6477**. Locate requests may also be made through the website ms811.org. After contacting 811, local utility companies will be notified of your project and will locate their buried lines. Located lines will be marked with paint and/or flags of varying colors.

HAWL Guest Policy

Property owners are completely responsible for the actions of their residents and guests during the duration of their time in the community. Property owners need to understand that if they register one guest and that guest brings in additional people with them, the property owner is also responsible for their actions as well while they are in the community. Please ensure that all residents and guests are made aware of the fact that HAWL proudly boasts a family environment on all common grounds (i.e. beach, pool, parks, roads etc.) and as such will not tolerate inappropriate behavior/actions such as cursing, crude actions, violence, and so forth. Property owners/residents should remain with their guests during

the duration of their visit if on any common grounds. Guests who are not with the property owner/resident while entering the community must be preregistered prior to their arrival in order to gain entry into HAWL. The inside lane must be used and the guest that is driving must present their driver's license upon arrival. The registration requires the correct spelling of the visitor's first and last names for quick entry.

Fireworks Rules

Any property owner using fireworks must abide by the following rules:

- 1. The use of fireworks is permissible only on *July* 3^{nd} and *July* 4^{th} .
- 2. Due to the potential of fire, the shooting of fireworks commonly referred to as "bottle" or "sky" rockets or similar projectiles that are mounted on a base that resembles a stick or rod is prohibited.

For Your Safety..

When grilling on common grounds, **ensure** that all grills are at least 50 feet away from structures to prevent fire safety issues.

Boats Anchored by the Dam

Boats anchored in open lake must be no further than 100 feet from shore and any swimmer from that boat must stay within 100 feet from shore. Moving vessels must stay out of this area of 100 feet from shore throughout the entire lake. Buoys have been placed in the water by the dam to mark 100 feet from shore. Boats are not to be anchored on the buoys.

Swimming Pool Hours

The swimming pool will open for everyone with lifeguards on Saturday, May 17, 2025.

The pool hours are as follows:

<u>Tuesdays - Saturdays: 10:00 am - 8:00 pm</u> <u>Sundays: 12:00 pm - 8:00 pm</u>

Pool will be open on Friday, July 4th from 10:00 am - 8:30 pm for 4th of July and on Saturday, July 5th from 10:00 am - 10:00 pm Band on the Beach.

- Guests will be charged to members' lot (no cash, checks, or debit/credit card).
- Only four guests permitted per lot.
- A picture ID must be presented to sign in.
- HAWL account must not be delinquent.

Parental Repsonsibility

It shall be a violation of the rule for a parent having legal custody of a minor normally to permit or, by inefficient control, to allow such minor to be or remain upon any subdivision street under circumstances not constituting an exception to, or otherwise beyond the scope of, the curfew rule. The term "knowingly" includes knowledge which a parent should reasonably be expected to have concerning the whereabouts of a minor in that parent's custody. It is intended to continue to keep neglectful or careless parents up to a reasonable community standard of parental responsibility through an objective test. It shall be no defense that a parent was completely indifferent to the activities or conduct or whereabouts of such minor child.

Swim Lessons

Each one-on-one session, taught by a certified lifeguard trained in swim instruction, will take place Tuesday - Friday from 9:00 am - 9:45 am. These weekly lessons will run from June through July. The cost is \$150.00 per session and there are only two spots available each week. Children must be potty trained and able to follow basic instructions. Lessons are nonrefundable and may only property owners may register swimmers. Lessons will be charged to the HAWL account. Call the HAWL Office at 601-798-1484 to register.

HAWL Credit Cards


HAWL credit cards can be purchased by the **property owner** in the HAWL Office and can be used by the property owner or registered resident to make charges on the account at the pool and in Waters Edge restaurant. The cards are valid for a period of one year and cost \$5.00 each. Please note, in order to purchase a HAWL credit card the property owner's account can NOT be past due – no exceptions.

Handicap Parking at the Lodge

The Lodge offers six handicap parking spaces at the Lower Level. To access these spaces, take the road near the tennis courts. These spots are intended for vehicles with handicap plates/tags. Please be courteous by not parking in these spaces so they may be used by those who need them.

In order to keep Hide-A-Way Lake beautiful, all residents need to work together to prevent and dispose of litter properly (including cigarette butts) in hopes that the litter problem will



No Glass Containers on Common Grounds

Glass containers are not allowed on common grounds: the beach, pool, parks, roads, etc.) If you see anyone with glass containers in these areas, call Security at 601-798-1247.

The use of any wake enhancing devices, including ballast tanks, wedges or hydrofoils or other mechanical devices, or uneven loading of persons or gear is prohibited. (No wake surfing is allowed.)

- Observe all Mississippi Boating Laws with respect to safety.
- Obey all traffic signs on the Lake.
- Property Owners are responsible for the actions of their residents and guests at all times.
- 4. If launching boat from community launching area by the Lodge, park vehicle and trailer behind tennis courts. Avoid using Lodge parking lot if possible. Do no park vehicle in boat launching area or pavilion area. Loading/unloading only permitted. If launching at Westside Marina, do not park so as to block traffic or access to the launching ramp.
- 5. Docking of boats in the boat launch area or at the launch pier in order to use adjacent facilities is prohibited.
- 6. Boats which are not registered with HAWL and guest boats will not be allowed on the lake at any time. Current decals must be attached in a location visible from each side of the vessel while the boat is on the water. Excluding manual powered vessels, all boats on the lake must have proof of \$300,000 minimum marine liability insurance in order to purchase a boat decal and either a copy of the boat title or state registration in the Property Owner's name only.
- Speed Limit: 40 MPH on open lake during daylight hours and "No Wake" speed at night or during periods of limited visibility.
- There is to be no skiing or PWC boats on the lake during nighttime, during periods of limited visibility, or when the light is flashing on the roof of the Lodge. All boats will then be limited to "No Wake" speed.
- 9. Do not operate any watercraft while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- 10. All boat traffic must travel in a **counter-clockwise** direction on the open lake.
- 11. Boats are not to exceed 24 feet in length. Original owners of larger boats registered prior to June 1, 1994, are exempt from this ruling.
- 12. All watercraft shall operate at idle speed in marked "No Wake" areas including marinas, bays, coves, and within 100 feet adjacent to the shoreline in the open lake.
- 13. Swimming in the vicinity of the marina launch areas shall be in the designated beach area only. For safety reasons, swimmers should not be farther than 50 feet from shore in the open lake. Swim at your own risk.
- 14. Boats anchored in open lake must be no further than 100' from shore and any swimmer from that boat must stay within 100' from shore. BOATS MAY NOT ANCHOR TO THE BUOYS.
- 15. When any motorboat, sailboat or PWC is under power, all persons riding therein shall remain within the watercraft; no person shall hang over the bow, stern or gunwales (side).
- 16. There shall be at least two persons in any boat which is towing a water skier, ski board, knee board, tube, or any other flotation device/vehicle; one to operate the boat and the other to face and observe the progress and safety of the person being towed. The boat operator of the towing vessel must be at least 15 years of age. The observer must be at least 10 years of age. It is mandatory that the person being towed wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved personal flotation device (PFD).
- 17. A tow boat must not enter into the "No Wake" area with a skier; however, the skier may swing in to the 100 foot area to drop skis. All water craft and skiers must stay 75 feet from any other watercraft or person. No boat shall follow closer than 150 feet behind a person being towed.
- 18. The basic requirements for all water craft defined in DEFINITIONS 1, 2, and 3, operating on HAWL waters are as follows:
 - I. A USCG approved personal flotation device (PFD) for each person on board.
 - II. Every person 12 years of age or younger is required to wear a USCG approved PFD while underway in the open lake in any watercraft defined in DEFINITIONS 1, 2, and 3, or in any canoe or kayak.
 - III. Red and green running lights mounted on the bow. Green to starboard (right side) and red to port (left side) and all around white light on the stern if operating at night.
 - IV. Fire extinguisher if inboard engine or enclosed fuel compartments.
- 19. All operators born after June 30, 1980, must have successfully completed a boater education course approved by the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks to legally operate a vessel. Anyone under the age of 12 years while operating a vessel must be accompanied by a person 21 years or older.
- 20. At no time shall any unauthorized person move or tamper with any marker or buoy on HAWL waters.
- 21. Follow all safety rules for your own protection as well as others. All accidents must be reported to the HAWL office as soon as possible.
- 22. Citations will be issued for violations of the General Boat Rules. Property Owners are responsible for the actions of their residents and guests. Property Owner's boat decal privileges on all their boats will be revoked for the remainder of the boating season should their lot incur three lake violations in one boat decal season.
- 23. Before launching a boat, empty bilge water and remove any vegetation from the boat/trailer.
- 24. Trot lines, jug fishing, and fish traps are not allowed.
- 25. Kill Switch Best Practice: Use your kill switch device. In the event that you lose control of your boat or accidentally fall overboard, it will save you or one of your boaters.

Community Assistance Is Needed to Maintain Roadway Safety

Community assistance is needed to maintain a safe environment for everyone who enjoys outdoor activities. Walkers, joggers, runners, bikers, golf cart drivers, and stand-upon scooter operators must exercise safety when on the roadways to not only maintain their safety, but the safety of others. Safety is a team effort and all of the following will be enforced by HAWL Security, but should also be enforced by property owners.

Safety Actions in Place

Property Owners voiced their concerns and actions are now in place:

- All fines for traffic citations are doubled in June and July.
- An extra patrolman is on duty to enforce traffic.
- Three radar signs are installed in the community to show drivers speeds.

The biggest difference maker in roadway safety is YOU. Help keep your community roadways safe.

Your Help Is Needed with Stand-Upon Scooters

Concerns have been brought forward from the community concerning stand-upon scooters. Parents: please be aware that these stand-upon scooters are not toys. These scooters have the major potential for serious accidents to occur if they are not monitored properly. Stand-upon scooter operators must abide by the same rules as cyclists.

Cyclist/Stand Upon Scooter Operator Safety:

1. Wear a helmet - strongly recommended.

- 2. Be visible; wear bright clothing during the day and reflective materials or use a flashlight at night.
- 3. Ride in the same direction as traffic.
- 4. Slow down and watch for cars backing out of
- 5. driveways.
- 6. Pass pedestrians/fellow cyclists/stand-upon scooter operators with care by first announcing that you are passing.
- 7. Do not ride more than two abreast.
- 8. Mississippi House Bill No. 559 requires that cyclists are subject to all provisions of traffic law subject to motorists. (Cyclists must obey all traffic rules and signs.)
- 9. Property Owners and parents are fully responsible for the actions of cyclists and stand-upon scooter operators, including minors.

Vehicle Driver Safety:

- 1. Look out for cyclists/stand-upon scooter operators at
- 2. Use extra caution when driving in hard-to-see conditions, such as nighttime or bad weather.
- 3. Yield to bicyclists/stand-upon scoot operators as you
- would motorists and do not underestimate their speed.

 4. Mississippi House Bill No. 3014 requires that while passing a cyclist, a driver shall leave a safe distance of no less than three feet between the cyclist and vehicle.

Walkers, Joggers, & Kunners in HAWL

The walking path on the dam/spillway is an ideal place to walk or jog as it provides breathtaking views of the lake. While these types of activities are encouraged, it is also important to keep safety in mind. Anyone walking, jogging, and/or running should wear bright or reflective clothing to ensure they are visible to drivers. According to the rules of the road, walkers, joggers, and runners must walk or jog on the shoulder of the road facing traffic.

Additionally, it is also the responsibility of drivers to watch out for these individuals. As a



driver, it is vital to remain undistracted while driving (i.e. no texting, speeding, etc.) in order to ensure the safety of everyone involved.

HAWL Golf Cart Rules 🕰



- 1. All golf carts must be registered in the Office and the Hide-A-Way Lake decal must be visible on the carts. Placement of the decal should be on the front driver's side of the golf cart.
- 2. Decals must be renewed each year.
- 3. Owners assume liability and operational responsibility by signing decal application form.
- 4. Driver must be a licensed automobile driver.
- 5. Driver must follow all traffic rules that apply to motor vehicles including stop signs, etc.
- 6. All riders must be seated.
- 7. All riders must keep arms and legs within the cart.
- 8. Driver will yield to traffic behind the cart by pulling over as soon as safely possible so not to create a rolling roadblock.
- 9. If a golf cart is driven after dark, it must have headlights and rear reflectors.

Whether you are in a vehicle, on a bike/scooter, or on foot, know your assigned location on the roadways. If we all

follow the rules of the road, the chance of an accident occurring is greatly reduced.
